

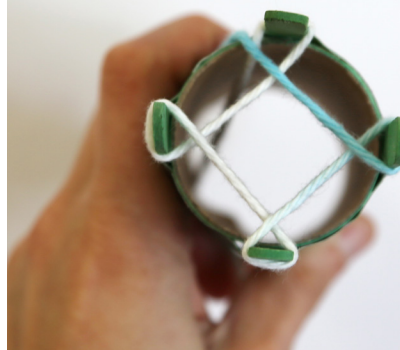
# MINI KNITTER!

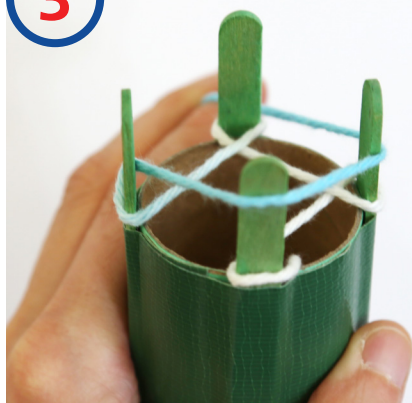
Using extra strong tape (duct tape or packing tape) to tape your sticks so they are 1" past the top of your craft tube as pictured. Make sure that all of the sticks are taped on at the same length, evenly spaced from each other.

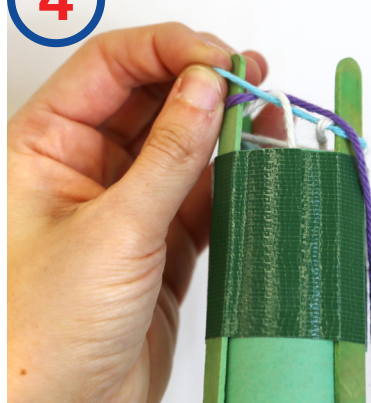
Find the end of your yarn and place it through the top of your craft tube so it dangles a few inches out the bottom. Using the yarn that comes from your ball, working around the circle, wrap the yarn around each stick so the strings cross on the inside.

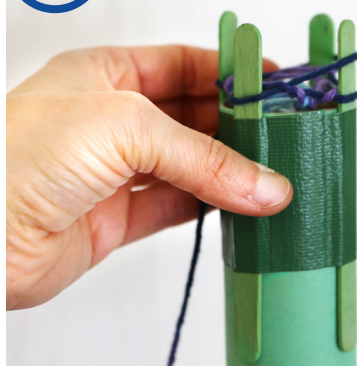
Using the yarn from your ball, following the same direction you were going, simply lay the yarn on the outside of the stick above the yarn loop that was already there.

Grab the bottom yarn loops and pull it out, go over the yarn loop you just laid down, and bring it over the top of the stick.

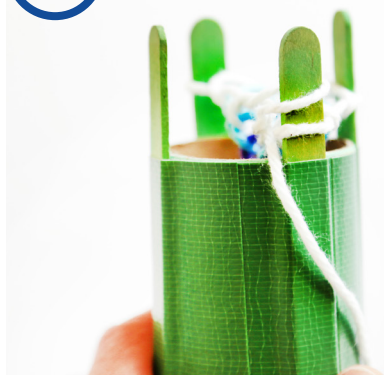
Continuing in the same direction, repeat steps 4 & 5. Knitting in a circular direction repetatively.

In time, your rope will start coming out the bottom. To make a belt continue to knit until it measures 12" longer than your waist.

To end your knitting, remove one loop and move it to the next stick, following the direction you've been working in. Bring the bottom yarn loop over the top and off the stick. Continue doing this until you're left with one loop on one stick.

Cut your string 12" from where it connects to your knitting. Remove the loop from the stick and place your string through the loop and gently pull.
